Original Narrative

02/24/2022 13:27:41

On the morning of 2/24/22 I received a text from Cornell High School Principal Elliott asking me to come to the high school. He reported that he'd investigated juvenile possession of alcohol yesterday and wanted to file a police report.

PRINCIPAL ELLIOTT INFORMATION:

I responded to the high school at about 11:00am and met with Principal Elliott in his office. He presented his written statement regarding [REDACTED], who had brought a half-full bottle of Fireball Cinnamon Whisky to school yesterday. Principal Elliott also presented the bottle. I opened and smelled it, and its scent was consistent with Fireball whisky.

Principal Elliott verbally recounted what had happened, which matched his written statement. Yesterday he was alerted by a student that [REDACTED] was showing a small bottle to students, saying she would drink until she got drunk. [REDACTED] was brought to the office in the presence of Principal Elliott and Administrative Assistant Hakes, where the Fireball was found in the pocket of [REDACTED] hoodie. Elliott contacted [REDACTED] parents and administered a 3-day out-of-school suspension, and informed them that police would be notified.

Elliott told me that [REDACTED] and said she claimed not to like alcohol. Elliott said he observed no signs that [REDACTED] had consumed alcohol, and said [REDACTED] understands what she did is wrong. Elliott did not know [REDACTED] motivation for bringing the alcohol to school, [REDACTED].

I took Elliott's statement, the Fireball, and [REDACTED] information to the police department.

ROBERT MILLER CONTACT:

At about 12:28pm I phoned [REDACTED] father, Robert Miller. I explained that I was not involved in school discipline but had been contacted by the school regarding the alcohol. I explained that I would be mailing a citation for juvenile possession of alcohol to [REDACTED] care of Miller, and that it included a mandatory appearance in municipal court. Miller did not deny or defend [REDACTED] actions, stating she knew it was wrong and she needed to learn that such behavior has consequences.

DISPOSITION:

I completed a citation for juvenile alcohol possession and mailed it to [REDACTED] along with a cover letter. I mailed a parent cover letter and copy of the citation to her father. I entered Elliott's statement into our filing system. I photographed the bottle and contents and then poured out the contents and disposed of the bottle. I downloaded the photo to our electronic file,
