

Original Narrative

02/24/2022 13:27:41

On the morning of 2/24/22 I received a text from Cornell High School Principal Elliott asking me to come to the high school. He reported that he'd investigated juvenile possession of alcohol yesterday and wanted to file a police report.

PRINCIPAL ELLIOTT INFORMATION:

I responded to the high school at about 11:00am and met with Principal Elliott in his office. He presented his written statement regarding which was a half-full bottle of Fireball Cinnamon Whisky to school yesterday. Principal Elliott also presented the bottle. I opened and smelled it, and its scent was consistent with Fireball whisky.

Principal Elliott verbally recounted what had happened, which matched his written statement. Yesterday he was alerted by a student that was showing a small bottle to students, saying she would drink until she got drunk. Was was brought to the office in the presence of Principal Elliott and Administrative Assistant Hakes, where the Fireball was found in the pocket of hoodie. Elliott contacted parents and administered a 3-day out-of-school suspension, and informed them that police would be notified.
Elliott told me that and said she claimed not to like alcohol. Elliott said he observed no signs that had consumed alcohol, and said understands what she did is wrong. Elliott did not know motivation for bringing the alcohol to school,
I took Elliott's statement, the Fireball, and information to the police department.
ROBERT MILLER CONTACT: At about 12:28pm I phoned father, Robert Miller. I explained that I was not involved in school discipline but had been contacted by the school regarding the alcohol. I explained that I would be mailing a citation for juvenile possession of alcohol to care of Miller, and that it included a mandatory appearance in municipal court. Miller did not deny or defend actions, stating she knew it was wrong and she needed to learn that such behavior has consequences.
DISPOSITION: I completed a citation for juvenile alcohol possession and mailed it to along with a cover letter. I mailed a parent cover letter and copy of the citation to her father. I entered Elliott's statement into our filing system. I photographed the bottle and contents and then poured out the contents and disposed of the bottle. I downloaded the photo to our electronic file,
