**Original Narrative**

**INITIAL INFORMATION:**

On 4/7/22 I received a telephone call from Principal David Elliott of Cornell High School stating he'd had an incident at the high school and would like assistance. I responded to the high school.

**SCENE INVESTIGATION:**

I met Elliott in his office and he summarized the situation, explaining that a student had grabbed another student by the hair and made possibly threatening statements. He provided a "Student Incident Form" completed by [REDACTED]. He also showed me a video, identifying [REDACTED] as the student who walked to a position behind [REDACTED], grabbed [REDACTED] by the hair, and appeared to speak something to her before releasing [REDACTED] and walking away.

I reviewed [REDACTED] statement, which said, "I was eating lunch and [REDACTED] walked up behind me and pulled my head back by the pony tail. She leaned in my ear and told me, 'This is from [REDACTED], if you try one more time she'll beat your ass.' and let go of me before walking away. I went straight to the office." [REDACTED] also identified other nearby students, with the nearest being [REDACTED].

[REDACTED] He said these two girls have been in conflict, with [REDACTED] accusing [REDACTED] of speaking ill of [REDACTED]. Elliott explained he was still contacting students for more information. He said [REDACTED] was in the school office area in another room. Elliott was willing to allow me to interview [REDACTED] regarding her actions, pending permission of [REDACTED] parent.

**INTERVIEW:**

I telephoned Latrisha Durkin (mother) and Joe Munson (father). I left a message on Durkin's phone requesting her to contact me regarding an incident at school. I was unable to leave a message on Joe's phone as the voicemail was full. A short time later Durkin called the school office, and I spoke to her when Elliott handed his phone to me at approximately 12:38pm.



I explained that [REDACTED] appeared to have been involved in an incident at school, and I wanted to know more about her role and what had happened. I said I was asking to interview [REDACTED] at school, for which I needed permission from Durkin, or that we could speak at another time, perhaps at the police department. Durkin granted me permission to speak with [REDACTED] in school. I asked her to inform Elliott of that, and gave the phone to Elliott, who had briefly stepped out of the room. Elliott summarized the situation shortly and Durkin reportedly gave him permission to allow me to interview [REDACTED] at school.

I activated my body camera as this could be evaluated as to whether it constituted a juvenile custodial interview. See that recording for the exact questions, responses, and wording of the interview, which is summarized here.

Elliott brought [REDACTED] into his office. She was seated closest to the exit door, with Elliott seated beside her with me seated in Elliott's chair. I told [REDACTED] she was not under arrest and was free to go as far as I was concerned. I explained that law enforcement and school investigations were separate and independent--although Elliott and I would discuss the situation, I didn't control what the school did, and he didn't control what I did. She indicated she understood.

I began by asking about our previous encounter earlier this morning. ([REDACTED] had approached my squad car while walking to school, stating they needed a picture of it for a project. I allowed them to take the picture.) I then transitioned into what had happened in the cafeteria, stating I'd like a more comprehensive understanding of why [REDACTED] had behaved as she did. [REDACTED] said that [REDACTED] had been spreading rumors. I asked when this started, and she said after Christmas. [REDACTED] had rumored that [REDACTED] was going to harm people, especially [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] described her relationship with [REDACTED] as a "close friend." She said [REDACTED] came after school started, at which point [REDACTED] "adopted" her. They became friends within a few weeks.

I asked [REDACTED] to describe her actions in detail. She said no one had asked her to do what she did. [REDACTED] said she had grabbed [REDACTED] hair, and, with some reported difficulty remembering her exact words, admitted she said something like, "This is for [REDACTED]. Keep her name out of your mouth and stop talking crap." [REDACTED] then walked away.

I asked [REDACTED] why she had suddenly done this. [REDACTED] said she had a sudden feeling--that she wanted to. She was unable to articulate exactly what made her suddenly perform the action. She said she felt bad now, and intended to apologize, although not apologize right now. She also shed a few tears at this point in apparent remorse.

I asked [REDACTED] if there was anything she wanted to tell me regarding the situation. She asked to speak to me privately and Elliott agreed to leave the room.

[REDACTED] said this was upsetting, as [REDACTED] had been described as a caretaker by Elliott, and [REDACTED] explanation of why she was upset at [REDACTED] aligned with Elliott's description of [REDACTED].

I summarized juvenile law for [REDACTED] and informed her I was likely to give her a juvenile citation for Disorderly Conduct, and not the less severe penalty of a juvenile referral. I also thanked [REDACTED] for trying to be forthright, and not justifying, minimizing, or defending her own actions.

#### FOLLOW-UP ACTIONS:

I spoke to Elliott, who presented me with another Student Incident Form, this one completed by [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] wrote, "[REDACTED] was eating when [REDACTED] came up from behind and grabbed her by the hair, yanked her head back and said something about [REDACTED] then said she would slit [REDACTED] throat, then walked away. [REDACTED] then left looking close to tears." Elliott was curious about the 'slit throat' comment and said he intended to contact other kids present to verify it, as that dramatic language hadn't been reported by [REDACTED]. He also intended to pursue whether [REDACTED] had requested [REDACTED] to take the action [REDACTED] did.

#### DISPOSITION:

Case remains open pending issuance of a citation to [REDACTED] and development of any further information.

#### ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

Following the issuance of this citation, Principal Elliott provided a statement identifying the involved students. He also provided video and names of students who may have spoken together near the commons entrance in the video who may have spoken with each other in planning this assault. Finally, he provided statements from additional students, including that of Cassidy Recker, who witnessed the event. See those statements for additional information.

KASSIDY RECKER STATEMENT:

In her statement, Recker said that she joined [REDACTED]. She reported that [REDACTED] was mad at [REDACTED] because she thought [REDACTED] was the reason [REDACTED] was leaving. [REDACTED] said she would pull [REDACTED] hair except she already had enough on her record, and Kourtney said she would except she's 18 and would therefore be subject to adult penalties, so the rest of the group told [REDACTED] what to do and say in regards to the attack. See Cassidy's statement for information regarding this pre-planning.

I viewed the video supplied by Elliott, which supports Recker's statement that people had been speaking to each other near the Commons Entrance, after which [REDACTED] walked away, spoke together, and then the attack occurred.

DISPOSITION:

Case closed.
