Original Narrative

09/21/2022 12:38:48

On 9/21/22 Principal David Elliott of the Cornell High School requested to meet with me. I responded to the high school and met him in his office.

Elliott told me that on Monday, September 19th there had been a disturbance at the junior varsity football game. While the adult monitor was attending to an injured student, [REDACTED] "slammed" a girl onto the ground. This was reportedly witnessed by multiple other students, and the school camera system showed [REDACTED] grabbing the female juvenile, with the "slamming" occurring just out of sight. Yesterday the girl's parents were contacted when she started having vision issues, and she was taken to the hospital where she was diagnosed with a concussion. Elliott said he had informed the parents of the ability of them to file a police complaint. However, as of this report no complaint has been forthcoming.

Elliott also said that [REDACTED] has been engaged in multiple disturbances on school property, even though he is no longer a student. [REDACTED] However, [REDACTED] now presented a clear danger to others, and Elliott intended to formally bar him from school property. I said that if the police department were to receive such a formal notification, we would cite [REDACTED] for trespassing if he was found violating that notice.

On 9/21/22 at 9:51am I received a copy of the letter that was sent to [REDACTED] parents. I later forwarded this to Lt. Bauman of CHSO for the Sheriff's Office information, and to patrol officers for their knowledge and enforcement.

Later in the day I was approached on Bridge Street by a man who identified himself as the victim's father. He said he understood the assailant [REDACTED] He said he wanted [REDACTED] held responsible, but was unsure entry into the juvenile justice system was the right way to do that. I said to contact the department if they wished to file a complaint.

Case closed barring a complaint from the female victim's family.
