

in the vacant school psychologist's office in Cornell Middle School. I introduced On 11/9/22 I met with myself and informed her that she was not under arrest, did not have to talk to me, and was free to leave if she wished. I videorecorded my interview on the body camera, which should be viewed for full and complete details of the interview.

I discussed vaping in school with for some time. She said she had been in the girl's bathroom when a friend had given her the vape. said she automatically accepts anything someone hands her. Shortly after the friend gave her the vape, a teacher

walked in and found with the vape in her hand. I asked for the friend's name, and said it was in the email she believed I had received. I said it may be in there, but I didn't recall the name. declined to provide the name, saying she didn't want her friend to get into trouble.

I asked how vaping could be reduced at school. She had no suggestions beyond installing vape detectors in the bathroom.

On 11/10/22 I prepared and issued a citation for possession of tobacco products at school, along with a parent notification letter.
