On Friday, November 4th I received two emails from Principal Dave Elliott of the Cornell Middle/High School regarding a vaping complaint. He informed me that [REDACTED] had been found with a vape pen/pod. He enclosed a statement form, a photograph of the vape, and forwarded an email from [REDACTED] regarding the source of the vape.

On Monday, November 7th I approached Elliott and asked if I could interview [REDACTED] at school. He said she was out of school until Wednesday on suspension. I said I would stop back on Wednesday.

Supplemental Narrative 11/10/2022 11:17:38 Glenn Rehberg - COPD

On 11/9/22 I met with [REDACTED] in the vacant school psychologist's office in Cornell Middle School. I introduced myself and informed her that she was not under arrest, did not have to talk to me, and was free to leave if she wished. I video-recorded my interview on the body camera, which should be viewed for full and complete details of the interview.

I discussed vaping in school with [REDACTED] for some time. She said she had been in the girl's bathroom when a friend had given her the vape. [REDACTED] said she automatically accepts anything someone hands her. Shortly after the friend gave her the vape, a teacher

walked in and found [REDACTED] with the vape in her hand. I asked for the friend's name, and [REDACTED] said it was in the email she believed I had received. I said it may be in there, but I didn't recall the name. [REDACTED] declined to provide the name, saying she didn't want her friend to get into trouble.

I asked [REDACTED] how vaping could be reduced at school. She had no suggestions beyond installing vape detectors in the bathroom.

On 11/10/22 I prepared and issued a citation for possession of tobacco products at school, along with a parent notification letter.

Case closed.
