



Original Narrative

01/27/2023 13:52:15

On 01/27/23 Jaime and Brandon Ketelboeter came to the police department to complain about bullying of their son, at Cornell Elementary School. They explained that had been held back a year and was now subsequently being bullied by . They said that had previously threatened or tried to take phone while on the school bus. Yesterday kicked Ethan 4 times while was on the ground in a game. Jaime displayed an email from Craig Braaten of the Cornell Area School District who had investigated the incident.

I explained that actions on the school bus were outside of my jurisdiction with their rural address, but that I would contact the school regarding the alleged assault. I explained that law enforcement intervention options were limited due to the ages of the involved children, but that I would attempt to reinforce and support interventions in place by the school. I asked them to contact me if physical attacks recurred. I also advised them that should attempt to maintain complete innocence in the situation so that it wasn't just two boys reciprocating bad behavior. They said the understood. I retained Jaime's written statement and issued a Crime Victim Information form, and they departed.

CORNELL ELEMENTARY SCHOOL:

I drove to Cornell Elementary School and spoke to Dr. Schley. He expressed surprise at the police contact, though he was fully aware of the incident. He explained that some sometimes verbally confronts other students and has begun touching girls, which has contributed to other students behavior. Dr. Schley said inappropriately "kicked" during a game in gym class and displayed the video, wherein I saw a kid identified as give a hard tap with his foot to another prone student. The kick did not appear to be one that would cause harm. Dr. Schley relayed the school's efforts to keep the boys separate, such as seating them in different parts of the school bus, different elective class schedules, etc.

I requested and obtained information for our records. Based on the level of behavior exhibited in the video, and the school's efforts to intervene, no law enforcement action is warranted.
